A VFW Message to Veterans in the Wake of Recent Events in Afghanistan

The following is a message from VFW National Commander Fritz Michelcic Aug 16, 2021 With the recent turn of events in Afghanistan, the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) wants the veterans of the war in Afghanistan to know we stand with you. Scores of VFW members know the anger, frustration, and sadness you are experiencing after hearing the troubling reports and seeing the disturbing images coming from lands where we sacrificed so much. From the fall of Saigon in Vietnam, to the withdraw from Somalia after the battle of Mogadishu, to the ISIS take-over of Fallujah, Ramadi, Mosul, and Tikrit, far too many of us have experienced the heavy burden of loss, disappointment, and helplessness our newest generations of veterans may be feeling watching the Taliban return to power. However, while there is bitter sentiment over this withdrawal, we encourage you to hold your head high. Because of your vigilance, hard work, and selfless sacrifice, you dealt a tremendous blow to Al-Qaeda, taking out its leader Osama Bin Laden, and disrupting its ability to plan and execute another major attack on American soil since September 11, 2001. You who served in Afghanistan with honor, valor, and distinction, our nation owes you a tremendous debt of gratitude for the past twenty years of relative safety and security. Your service was not in vain. While we continue to watch events unfold in Afghanistan, we remind our brothers and sisters that we are beside you, arm-in-arm, ready to support you. You are not alone. Please know that through the Department of Veterans Affairs, the VFW, and other nonprofit organizations, there are people you or a battle buddy can talk to and resources available to help cope with the stress of the situation.

SERVICE OFFICER NEWS & INFORMATION

The Service Office has moved into the new Chuck Austin Place, located at 1630 South 16th Avenue (the old Marine Corps Armory). Nadine Newman, VA Accredited Claims Consultant, is available Monday through Thursday to assist veterans and their family members with claims, by appointment. Walk-ins will be seen as time permits.

Upon arrival the veteran / family member will stop in the lobby waiting area where there is a phone-intercom to notify the Service Officer of their arrival. Then, the Service Officer will go to the waiting area to greet the veteran and escort them to a secure office.

Do you know the difference between a "Certified Service Officer" and a "VA Accredited Service Officer"? A VA Accredited Service Officer is allowed to give claims advice, and in some instances, sign claim forms on behalf of the veteran or claimant. They also have advanced training and skills, have completed a Federal background check and have been issued an Accreditation number by the Department of Veterans Affairs. Further, some VA Accredited Claims Consultants have a security badge that allows them to access the Veterans Benefits Administration's claim system.

A "Certified Service Officer" (also known as a Post Service Officer) has been trained by the organization that issued a certification to them. They are NOT allowed to give claims advice and are NOT allowed to sign documents on behalf of the veteran or claimant. They ARE allowed to assist in filling-out the claim forms, but not give advice on how to file a claim, or what statement to make regarding a claim. How do you find out the difference? Ask the Service Officer for their "Accreditation Number". It's is simple as that!

We are fortunate that Nadine Newman has both a VA Accreditation (#31736) AND a security badge to access the VA claims system. Access to the VA claims system allows her to review claim history, check status of claims, and advise on how to proceed with a claim, when the VFW is the veteran, or claimant's, representative.

VA is now processing [disability claims](#) for asthma, rhinitis and sinusitis on a presumptive basis based on particulate matter exposures during military service in Southwest Asia and certain other areas – if these conditions manifested within 10 years of a qualifying period of military service.

This will expand benefits for Veterans who served in:

- Afghanistan, Djibouti, Syria, and Uzbekistan during the Persian Gulf War, from September 19, 2001, to the present, **or**

The Southwest Asia theater of operations from August 2, 1990, to the present

If you have a pending claim for one or more of these conditions, you don't need to do anything. We'll send you a decision notice when we complete our review.
